Master's Degree in Education Administration
leading to recommendations for both
School Building Leader and School District Leader Certification

Overview:

This master's degree program is designed to prepare New York State certified teachers and pupil personnel service providers for roles in administration and supervision of Pre-K through Grade 12 educational settings.

The Education Administration Master's Degree is a clinically rich program, embedding coursework and fieldwork seamlessly as participants lead change at the student, adult and system level. Our program is a cohort-model led by expert instructors, fully integrating important education leadership related concepts into core fieldwork and internship assignments. This model supports a mastery-based approach with feedback that focuses on the participants' growth as well as the assignment itself. Courses take place on one afternoon/evening per week.

Upon successful completion of the two-year program, graduates will receive a Master's degree in Educational Leadership and recommendation for New York State School Building Leader (SBL) and School District Leader (SDL) certifications.

Total Credits/Courses: 32 credits (Eight, 4-credit courses)

Time Frame: 4 semesters -- 2 courses each semester
(Fall 2020/Spring 2021, Fall 2021/Spring 2022)

Location: Courses will be offered at the Greenburgh Central School District on Tuesdays at 4:30pm.

Start Date: Fall 2020 (Sept. 1- Dec. 15) Maximum cohort size=25
**If there is enough interest, another cohort will begin in January 2021.

Application Deadline: March 15, 2020

Course Type: Courses will be hybrid (partial in-person/partial on-line)

Total Cost of Program: CUNY Tuition Prices (about \$16,000) + \$150 registration fee each semester through EWTC MLP

Eligibility & Admission Requirements:

This program is designed for applicants who possess a master's degree and hold permanent or professional NYS certification as a teacher or pupil personnel service provider within grades PreK-12.

- A master's degree from an accredited college or university, with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0
- Permanent or professional NYS certification as a teacher or pupil personnel service provider within grades PreK-12
- A minimum of three years of approved teaching and/or school service within grades PreK-12 under regular appointment (or its equivalent for counselors, social workers, and school psychologists) or two years approved teaching and/or school service and at least one year of relevant management/leadership experience
- Two letters of recommendations, including a letter of support from your current principal
- On-site writing test and oral interview
- A statement of purpose. Include your first and last name, and "Teacher Center APPLICANT" in your header. Your statement should address your interest in the Teacher Center track.
- An official Graduate Record Examination (GRE) General Test score report is required for applicants who do not hold NYS teacher certification
